

Whately School Committee Meeting

Monday, December 6, 2010

MINUTES

Present: Chair Nathanael Fortune, Robert Halla and Don Skroski; Principal Pete Crisafulli; and Superintendent Regina H. Nash

Chair Nathanael Fortune called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.

Robert Halla moved, seconded by Donald Skroski, to approve the Minutes of November 1, 2010. Approved 3-0.

There was no Financial Report.

There was no Public Comment.

Debra Lane, Coordinator, provided an overview of the Out-of-School Time program and the many activities and enrichment sessions that it offers at the school. Currently, there are 10 students who attend the Before School program and 12-22 students who attend the After School program.

Under Unfinished Business, Donald Skroski moved, seconded by Robert Halla, to endorse the Frontier Regional and Union #38 School Districts' Bullying Prevention and Intervention Plan. Approved 3-0.

Under New Business, Superintendent Nash presented the Proposed FY12 Budget and provided an overview of the General Analysis Sheet and the FY2012 Non-Budget Revenue and Expenses. At this time, the budget calls for an overall increase of 2.06%. There will be continued discussion at the January meeting.

Under Committee Reports, Nathanael Fortune, who attended the MASC/MASS Joint Annual Conference as the Committee's liaison, reported on the MASC resolutions approved at the 2010 meeting. He also provided an overview of the workshops he attended.

Principal Crisafulli, in the Principal's Report, spoke to the mounting of the video projectors by the Franklin County Technical School students. It saves our school money as well as providing a field experience for the Tech students. He also reported that the fence project has been completed and that the school sign has been repainted on the south side.

It was noted that Paula King, the Library/Media Specialist, had hand-selected and transported 1,225 non-fiction, chapter books and picture books from the now closed WMRLS building, to bolster the school's library collection. These books added up to approximately \$18,000, a tremendous savings to the school.

Superintendent Nash, in the Superintendent's Report, spoke to the recently named M.A.S.S. Annual Student Award for Excellence, Nick McGlew, a senior at Frontier Regional School. She also recognized the Girls Volleyball Team as the new state champions. Dr. Nash also recognized and thanked all members of the Emergency Response Teams who helped in locating a missing student in Conway.

Donald Skroski moved, seconded by Robert Halla, to adjourn the meeting at 7:45 p.m.
